The United States Lactation Consultant Association (USLCA) joins the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in urging Americans to take action steps that will save lives in the event of a fire, natural disaster or other unexpected event. To the CDC, this means developing a family disaster plan, gathering emergency supplies, learning how to shelter where you are, understanding quarantine and isolation, and learning how to maintain a healthy state of mind (http://www.cdc.gov/features/beready/).

To this important list, USLCA would add promoting and supporting breastfeeding. Surprised? Throughout the world, tragedies occur when disaster strikes and access to clean water and commercial products is limited. In our nation each and every year, hurricanes, blizzards, and other emergencies jeopardize water supply and access to commercial products available in stores.
