What is Urban Ecology?

An urban ecology is the relationship between black lactating people (or those that want to) and the built physical environment around them that influence how black lactating people thrive.

How are these built physical environments effecting the right to Black Food Soveriengty?

These build physical environments effect Black lactating people's ability to tap into their right to Black foodways. Black Food Sovereignty is the right to foods that are historical, traditional culturally relevant and sustainable. Lactation is the first foodway for Black people and was taken away due to racism and slavery. These built environments also contribute to consumerism and products such as formula and lactation supplements and denounces the Black traditions of the use of herbs and farming.

What are the built physical environments?

These built physical environments that have influence on Black lactating people include the cities, communities, and etc that make up urban areas.
